Peter Hirst

We learnt from his daughter Pauline just before Christmas that Peter had died on 22 December after his long illness. I don't think any of us realised just how poorly he had been.

Peter joined the Society in July 2009 and was involved in virtually all projects during the long time as a member. His help was often called upon when electronics or electrical matters were involved. He was also a regular 'researcher' when we needed to identify a new item of equipment or tool - he would often find a reference in an old journal or catalogue that specified the item.





He spent a lot of time on open days in the engine room beside the Cornish boiler where he would be either be found explaining its working to visitors or polishing the brassware.

After earlier beam engine drivers such as Tony Penry and David Jones no longer came to the mill, Peter assumed the role of engine driver and was eventually elevated to Head of Technical Area.

Peter had also performed the role of our PAT tester until recently.

Even during his later illness when he needed to carry an oxygen supply, Peter was very keen to carry on to complete the 2023 steaming calendar year, which he did.

Peter was a quiet unassuming man who got on with everyone and he will be sadly missed.

We have send a condolence card to Pauline and Peter's funeral will take place on Monday 15 January at I Iam at our Lady and St Hugh Roman Catholic Church, Welch Way, Witney followed by burial at Windrush cemetery and a wake at the Windrush Inn, Burford Road, Witney.
